All dogs attending the show must be entered, either in the breed classes or Not for Competition, there will be no charge for dogs entered in NFC. Dogs under six months of age may not be entered for competition, although dogs over 4 months of age may be entered "Not For Competition".

B.I.S, Res B.I.S. and Best Puppy will be judged after Class 12. All unbeaten dogs and bitches will compete for these awards as usual, regardless of whether or not they win best of their classification.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show Award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club Ltd. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the first closing date shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. MONDAY 6th MARCH 2023.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.

If the exhibitor reports before the judging of any class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) WITHDRAWAL. The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.
- (2) TRANSFER.
 - (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - (b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. F(1) 9K (2) (b)
 - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

PUPPY:

For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR:

For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE:

For dogs which have not won three or more First Prizes at any Show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

POST GRADUATE:

For dogs which have not won five or more First prizes at Championship and Open Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes whether restricted or not.

LIMIT:

For dogs which have not won seven or more First prizes in all, at Championship and Open Shows in Limit and Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not .

OPEN:

For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (Annex B)

- These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Ltd Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Ltd Rule A42.
 - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule 42.
- (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
 - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition
- 3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
 - (c) The shortening of tails of customarily docked breeds but only up to an acceptable age limit which shall be prescribed from time to time.
 - (d) Operations to prevent breeding, provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club Ltd before neutered dogs are shown.
 - Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
- The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club Ltd in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club Ltd. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club Ltd will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The Show will open not before 11.00 am.
- 2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence after the Irish Wolfhound classes at the Hound Show
- 4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- 6. ENTRY FEES: Members and Associates only £5.00 First Entry Per Dog, Subsequent entries same Dog

NFC (Not For Competition) No charge.

FULL/ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP FEES: Single £12.00; Joint £18.00; Overseas £15.00.

- 7. PRIZE MONEY: There is no prize money on offer at this Show.
- 8. The Committee reserve to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 11. Best Puppy in Show

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively.

Best in Show must be selected from exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected. the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best

- 13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of
- 15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 16. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club Ltd offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

- 17. Breach of Kennel Club Ltd Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Ltd Rules and Regulations. Right to Refuse Entries. - 18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Dogs over 4 months of age may be entered. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Ltd registered.
- 19. All entries must be made on or before Monday 13th March 2022
